### Church of England Aims to be Net Carbon Zero by 2030

In February 2020, the Church of England set new targets for all parts of the church to work to become carbon "net zero" by 2030. Following the debate, the Bishop of Salisbury, Nick Holtam, the church's lead bishop on Environmental Affairs, said, "This is a clear statement of intent across the church and to wider society about our determination to safeguard God's creation. This is a social justice issue, which affects the world's poorest soonest and most severely, and if the Church is to hold others to account, we have to get our own house in order".

As part of the Church of England we are looking at ways to play our part in this ambitious plan.

### Eco Church Survey

St Mary's is taking part in this free online survey set up by the Christian environmental charity, "A Rocha UK". It has five parts: worship and teaching; buildings; churchyard and land; engagement with local community and global campaigns; personal lifestyles of our congregation. We are making good progress working towards the "Bronze Award". We will keep you updated via this newsletter and the Creation Care page on the church website. Our diocese, St Albans, announced on 17<sup>th</sup> October 2020 that it is working towards the Bronze Award as an "Eco-Diocese", and called on every diocese to do the same.

**Our Churchyard** is "closed" which means that no further burials can take place in it, and the Town Council is responsible for its overall maintenance. However, the church can still bury ashes and do some gardening. We are exploring with the council what we can do help nature in the churchyard. Possibilities include a wild-flower area, planting trees with berries and putting up nesting boxes.

- As cold weather approaches, feed birds in your garden
- Make sure your house is well insulated and draught-proofed - will save you money and keep you warmer
- Eat less meat (needs more resources to produce)
- Walk or cycle rather than use the car, when you can
- Make sure your toilets are dual flush (church toilets are now all dual flush)

- Don't overfill your kettle - heating water you don't need wastes energy
