

Dear all,

As we come to the last two sermons on Ezekiel, you will be pleased to know that we turn from messages of judgement to ones of hope. We also arrive at one of the passages in Ezekiel that you probably know - even if you didn't realise it is from Ezekiel. 'Dem dry bones' is a well-known negro spiritual. Ezekiel is sent to preach in a graveyard where the bones of fallen Israel are lying.

As he preached a message of resurrection and life, flesh came onto the bones and then the Spirit of God gave life. A prophecy of a restored Israel, but so much more than that. This passage is the beginnings of belief in the resurrection of all Israel at the end of the age – the sort of hope that Martha expresses in John 11.24.

We have a resurrection hope that is centred in Jesus raised from the dead. We look forward to not just our personal resurrection, but that God will restore the whole universe spoilt by sin as Paul explains in Romans 8. 23ff. Ezekiel also spoke of a restored Eden and we see that in Revelation 22.

So we can begin to see Ezekiel not just as a prophet of God's judgement on nations long dead, but one who gives to Israel and us hope of the ultimate blessing that God has for his people.
