

Dear all,

Greetings to you all in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

This coming Sunday we continue our series of sermons on the book of the prophet **Ezekiel**, and Tim has asked me to tackle the subject of **The God who judges**, based on **Ezekiel 25** where God pronounces judgement on four nations that surrounded Israel (Thanks Tim!). [*Tim responds saying 'You're welcome George!'*]

You will sometimes hear someone say, '*If I had a pound for every time I heard someone say…I'd be rich*'. Though I don't think it would make me rich, there have been many occasions over the years when I've heard people say, including some Christians, that the **Old Testament** primarily reveals a **God of judgement**, and the **New Testament** primarily reveals a **God of love**.

In response I've always said that the **Old Testament** has a great deal to say about the **love of God**, and equally the **New Testament** has a great deal to say about the **judgement of God**, including from the lips of **Jesus** (not just '*gentle Jesus, meek and mild*').

Following Tim's request for me to preach this coming Sunday, I thought I'd better turn to my Bible Concordance to find out how many times both the judgement of God and the love of God are mentioned in both the Old and the New Testament to back up the above assertion. You'll be surprised at what I discovered – listen in on Sunday morning to find out more.
