

Dear all,

Greetings to you all in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. This coming Sunday we reach the midpoint in our mini-series entitled **Remembering**, **Reflecting and Recovering** – designed to help us as we hopefully continue to slowly emerge from the Covid 19 pandemic. For this Sunday's sermon Tim has asked me to use **Psalm 90** as a starting point in looking at the subject of **Reflecting** – so what does that word mean?

The Concise Oxford Dictionary provides quite a range of definitions for what it means to **reflect**, but perhaps the most helpful for our purpose is to **go back in thought, to meditate or consult with oneself, to remind oneself or consider**. The actual word only appears four times in the Old Testament and three times in the New Testament. We will probably be most familiar with the three New Testament verses:

1 Corinthians 13:12 – For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face.

2 Corinthians 3:18 – We all, who with unveiled faces reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into His image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.

2 Timothy 2:7 – Reflect on what I am saying, for the Lord will give you insight into all this.

Join with me in our livestreamed service on Sunday, as using these verses alongside **Psalm 90**, we will together seek to **reflect** on our Covid 19 experience.
