Firstly a big thank you to the St Mary's congregation for their very generous giving of dried food for the Harvest Festival Appeal this year. Steve Bailey was able to deliver 14 boxes of food to the collection centre, all of which will now be making their way to Christians, associated with Food.gives, somewhere in the world who will be greatly encouraged by our brotherly support.

## **Youth Café**



We are very excited to be launching our new Youth Cafe! This will be run under the umbrella of Youth for Christ. We plan to start in mid-January in the church hall.

There is already a Youth Cafe at Loves Farm and they gather around 25 young people from unchurched homes! After one term, 8 did a Youth Alpha and started going to the Loves Farm Breakfast Church! A second one started at SNEC and sees regular youth come each week. Lots of youth have then gone onto attend church youth clubs and some have joined discipleship groups.

What it is: We want to provide a warm, friendly, kind space with snacks and the offer of games and chat, to children as they walk home from school. Many children go home to an empty house so this is a safe alternative. It is for any secondary school-aged pupil. No younger siblings, no adults, other than safeguarded and DBS checked leaders.

It is for any faith or no faith. It is not a place where we instigate God conversations, unless the youth instigate it. But, what flows out from this group is the opportunity to invite young people to discuss bigger questions, 'Is there more to life than this?' 'Was Jesus good, bad or mad?'

We can also invite them to other church activities.

#### What we need:

- People to pray
- Some volunteers to add to our team some who
  like to play cards and chat, some who are happy to wash-up or make
  toasties and milkshakes.
- People who might be willing to give an offering to help us start up the cafe or even to buy youth bibles for when we need them!



This is an exciting new venture which we hope will ultimately help and encourage young people back into church. Please join us in any way you can and be part of this life changing journey.
